 - Attended by about 8 parents; Sylvia Aschliman was present
 - Themes that came up: homework conflicts with extracurricular activities; MS is very grade focused causing stress; PT conferences (6th grade missing personalized comments; 7th grade, student led, not always informative for parents); lack of tutorials, especially compared to old MS schedule; currently tutorial time too short to get work done, more used for socializing; intention of new MS schedule (90min periods include tutorial-like time) not consistently met; plans for playgrounds on Lab logs and Pebbles
- Middle School Parent to Parent (Jan 4)
 - The Parent to Parent was attended by about 7 parents; Sylvia Aschliman was present; Ned Reece, Nancy Kubel and Cecilia Mullen joined to talk about Summer Lab 2017
 - Themes that came up: After school programs don't offer a lot of choices for MS students; need for study opportunities, especially on short Wednesdays; (suggestions) could library be open earlier the AM and later in the PM and staffed by parent volunteers?; other on campus locations for 'study hall' with parent oversight?; change in

atmosphere around Lab after dismissal (kids used to be welcome to hang around after school, now don't feel welcome); FreedomPay (allow for credit if funds are insufficient? Possible to see what was bought?)

Past Activities:

- I. Dec. 1st Lobby Decorating: Winter Festival
 - LS Council and about 5 volunteers decorated Blaine Lobby into a wintery festival. Weather related decorations included snowflakes, tinsel, greenery, garlands, lights, etc. The decorations were received well by parents, students and faculty.
- II. Dec. 2nd Principal Chat

Principal Sylvie Anglin presented the two computer science teachers, Wales and Schwartz, as they have new and innovative curriculum to share. The demonstrated their curriculum regarding blocking, coding and typing. Approximately 20 parents attended.

It was agreed that having a featured administrator or faculty program that touches upon 3rd, 4th and 5th grade was being well received by the parent community. Turnout has been good, with different and new parents attending.

- Lobby Decorating: MLK Birthday LS Council decorated Blaine Lobby for MLK's birthday. Quotes of his "dream speech" were included. The question is asked, "What's Your Dream?" LS students are encouraged to write down a dream they have for themselves, their families, and their communities. Pictures will be posted on the PA website and Facebook page.
- II. Box Tops Campaign (1/31 2/24) There has been a lengthy discussion regarding the next Box Tops campaign. Sylvie and Joanne strongly prefer that the prize *not* be selfserving. We decided not have to a class prize, and just educate the kids that their Box Tops goes to help other people. Teachers Weide, Sukenic, Ruelas and Mitzenmacher have been asked to make posters, collages or drawings showing how their students used the community service grant to help Syrian Refugees. LS Council will also create flyers linking the Box Tops to the community service grant; and a thermometer to track the Box Top collection rate.
