I. "Transition" Dates

II. Parent to Parent Transition Tours

Now that the "Transition" dates have been established, planning for our rising 3rd grade parent tours can begin. III. Parent to Parent Meetings 2017-2018

Andee and Vanessa are interested in exploring quarterly parent to parent meetings for Lower School, next year. They will be similarly modeled after HS and MS' parent to parent, where a Learning and Counseling coordinator will attend. These are meant to address parenting issues, be it navigating social relationships, homework, bedtimes, etc.

IV. Grade Level Events

Although three 4th grade parents stepped forward to organize a grade level event, it appears that it may not happen due to the late scheduling. Sara has been following up with Jeff Schmidt to see if additional assistance is needed.

On the other hand, Vanessa and EJ Joshi may be moving forward with hosting a third grade level event at Cradles to Crayons for early June.

Tina Louie announced that there are talks for a 5th grade level event.



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Next year, LS Council may consider appointing one council person to be in charge of all grade level events. That person could book the room/gym in advance, recruit parent volunteers to execute it, provide a budgetary framework for food and entertainment, speak to previous council members for old and new ideas, etc. Providing our volunteers with some structure, may be helpful in the execution of a grade level event.

VIII. Box Tops

A long discussion was had about the current state of box tops. The following was decided:

- a spring campaign will move forward;

- a warning to parents will be made that we did not meet our collection goals;

- Sylvie will discuss with grade level chairs about teacher interest in box tops, including whether a reward and/or competition is inconsistent with Lab culture and community service mission; is the idea of a community service grant, not enough of an incentive to encourage kids to collect more;

- a collection bag will be available at the entrance of every class door

Sylvie believes that teachers and kids would collect more in due time. The idea of collecting for a community service grant hasn't existed long enough to sink in.



Cathy believes that the 22% drop in collection is due to the fact that there isn't a reward and competition between classes. Sylvie believes that there isn't enough data to make any conclusions.

The Pa has decided that if 12,000 box tops isn't collected by the end of the year, then the community service grant cannot be supported through this separate, dedicated stream.
